

LITURGY OF THE WORD

THE LESSON: Wisdom 3.1-9

THE SOULS of the righteous are in the hand of God, and there shall no torment touch them. In the sight of the unwise they seemed to die; and their departure is taken for misery, and their going from us to be utter destruction; but they are in peace. For though they be punished in the sight of men, yet is their hope full of immortality. And having been a little chastened, they shall be greatly rewarded; for God proved them and found them worthy for himself. As gold in the furnace hath he tried them, and received them as a burnt-offering. And in the time of their visitation they shall shine, and run to and fro like sparks among the stubble; they shall judge the nations and have dominion over the people, and their Lord shall reign for ever and ever.

in them the good purpose of thy perfect will; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Amen.

THE LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

The Deacon invites the people to join in this general Confession, for which all kneel.

ALmighty GOD, Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Maker of all things, Judge
of all men: We acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness,
Which we from time to time most grievously have committed, By thought,
word, and deed, Against thy Divine Majesty. We do earnestly repent, And are
heartily sorry for these our misdoings. Have mercy upon us, most merciful
Father; For thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake, Forgive us all that is past; And
grant that we may ever hereafter Serve and please thee In newness of life, To the
honour and glory of thy Name; Through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

*Then shall the Presider stand up, and turning himself to the people,
pronounce this Absolution:*

ALmighty GOD, our heavenly Father, who of his great mercy hath promised
forgiveness of sins to all them that with hearty repentance and true faith
turn unto him: Have mercy upon you; pardon and deliver you from all your sins;
confirm and strengthen you in all goodness; and bring you to everlasting life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

OFFERTORY: Domine Jesu Christe

The congregation may sit, but stand again at the conclusion

OLD JESUS CHRIST, King of glory, deliver the souls of all the faithful
departed from the pains of hell and from the deep pit: deliver them from the
lion's mouth, that hell may not swallow them up, and may they not fall into
darkness; but may the holy standard-bearer, Michael, lead them into the holy

prayers we offer to Thee, O Lord; receive them for the souls for whom we make
memorial this day; let them O Lord, pass from death unto life. Which Thou didst
promise to Abraham and his seed.

All remain standing while the Presider sings the preface:

IT IS VERY meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, holy Father, almighty, everlasting God, creator and preserver of all things through Jesus Christ our Lord; who rose victorious from the dead, and doth comfort us with the hope of resurrection and the promise of eternal life. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious name; evermore praising thee and saying:

SANCTUS

HOLY, Holy, Holy, Lord God of hosts, Heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he that cometh in the Name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

EUCCHARISTIC PRAYER

BLESSING AND GLORY and thanksgiving be unto thee Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to take our nature upon him, and to suffer death upon the Cross for our redemption; who made there, by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy Gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memorial of that his precious death, until his coming again.

Hear us, O merciful Father, we most humbly beseech thee; and grant that we receiving these thy creatures of bread and wine, according to thy Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed Body and Blood; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took Bread; and, when he had given thanks, he brake it; and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat; this is my Body which is given for you: Do this in remembrance of me. Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and,

when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all, of this; for this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy Bread of eternal life and the Cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded; And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion; And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end.

*And all the people shall answer: Amen
and then say together:*

OUR FATHER

OUR Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. After a short period of silence the Presider says:

THE PEACE of the LORD be always with you:

this prayer of humble access:*

WE DO NOT PRESUME to come to this thy Table, O merciful Lord, Trusting in our own righteousness, But in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy So much as to gather up the crumbs under thy Table. But thou art the same Lord, Whose property is always to have mercy: Grant us therefore, gracious Lord, So to eat the Flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, And to drink his Blood, That our sinful bodies may be made clean by his Body, And our souls washed through his most precious Blood, And that we may evermore dwell in him, And he in us. Amen.

THE CONTAKION

GIVE REST, O CHRIST, to thy servants with thy saints, where sorrow and pain
are no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting. Thou only art immortal,
the creator and maker of all; and we are mortal, formed of the earth, and to earth
shall we return. For so thou didst ordain when thou createdst me, saying, "Dust
thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return." All we go down to the dust; yet even
at the grave we make our song: Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

Give rest, O Christ, to thy servants with thy saints, where sorrow and pain are
no more, neither sighing, but life everlasting.

Then follow these prayers:

O ALMIGHTY GOD, the God of the spirits of all flesh, who by a voice from heaven didst proclaim, blessed are the dead who die in the Lord: Multiply, we beseech thee, to those who rest in Jesus the manifold blessings of thy love, that the good work which thou didst begin in them may be made perfect unto the day of Jesus Christ.

And of thy mercy, O heavenly Father, grant that we, who now serve thee here on earth, may at the last, together with them, be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light; for the sake of the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

O LORD JESU CHRIST, Son of the living God, we pray thee to set thy Passion, Cross, and Death between thy judgement and our souls, now and in the hour of our death.

Vouchsafe to grant mercy and grace to the living, pardon and rest to the dead, to thy holy Church peace and concord, and to us sinners everlasting life and glory; who with the Father and the Holy Spirit livest and reignest God world without end.
