LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING: Acts 10.34-43

Then Peter began to speak to them: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ — he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."




SECOND READING: Colossians 3.1-4

GOSPEL: John 20.1-18 *R / Glory be to thee, O Lord*

The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre. Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him. Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre. So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre. And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in. Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the linen clothes lie, And the napkin, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself. Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed. For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the dead. Then the disciples went away again unto their own home. But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: and as she wept, she stooped down, and looked into the sepulchre, And seeth two angels in white sitting, the one at the head, and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain. And they say unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, Because they have taken away my Lord, and I know not where they have laid him. And when she had thus said, she turned herself back, and saw Jesus standing, and knew not that it was Jesus. Jesus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and I will take him away. Jesus saith unto her, Mary. She turned herself, and saith unto him, Rabboni; which is to say, Master. Jesus saith unto her, Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father: but go to my brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to my God, and your God. Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken these things unto her.

HOMILY

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Thanksgiving over water

Celebrant: LET us pray.

Almighty God, we thank thee for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water thou didst lead the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water thy Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the holy Spirit as Messiah, the Christ, to lead us through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life. We thank thee, O Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death; through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to thy Son, we celebrate our fellowship in him in faith. Sanctify (+) this water, we beseech thee; and grant that all who have passed through the water of baptism may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour; To whom, with thee and the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever. *Amen*

Following this, the Celebrant says:

Dear friends, through the paschal mystery we have died and been buried with Christ in baptism, so that we may rise to new life. Now that our Lenten observance is ended, let us renew the promises we made in baptism, when we rejected Satan and all his works, and promised to serve God faithfully in his Holy Catholic Church.

Celebrant: Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

People: I do.

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Father?

People: I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth;

Celebrant: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

People: I believe in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, Born of the

Virgin Mary Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, dead, and buried: He descended into hell; The third day he rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty: From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.

Celebrant: Do you believe in God the Holy Ghost?

People: I believe in the Holy Ghost; The holy Catholic Church; The Communion of Saints; The Forgiveness

of sins; The Resurrection of the body, And the Life everlasting.

Presider: Will you endeavour to keep God's holy will and commandments, and to walk in the same all

the days of your life?

People: I will, God being my helper.

Almighty God, our Creator and the rock of our salvation, who hast given us new birth by water and the Holy Spirit, and bestowed upon us the forgiveness of sins; Keep us faithful to our baptism, and so make us ready for that day when the whole creation shall be made perfect in thy Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ; who liveth and reigneth with thee and the same Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen*.

The Celebrant then asperges the congregation with Easter water.

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, Creator and Preserver of all things.

But chiefly are we bound to praise thee for the glorious Resurrection of thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord: for he is the very Paschal Lamb, which was offered for us, and hath taken away the sin of the world; who by his death hath destroyed death, and by his rising to life again hath restored to us everlasting life.

Therefore with Angels and Archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we laud and magnify thy glorious Name; evermore praising thee and saying:

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

Likewise after supper he took the Cup; and, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, Drink ye all, of this; for this is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy Bread of eternal life and the Cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded; And we entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion; And we pray that by the power of thy Holy Spirit, all we who are partakers of this holy Communion may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father Almighty, world without end. *Amen.*
