ST THOMAS'S PUBLIC WORSHIP at 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 am

All three morning Masses are in-person, and the 9:30 and 11:00 am Eucharists are also livestreamed on YouTube. The 4:00 pm Evensong and Coffee Hour on Zoom will continue through Lent. In-person Evensong will return on May 1.

Masks are still required until May 1. The mask must be an N95, KN95, or acceptable equivalent. Exemptions are allowed as provided for by law; please inform a sidesperson if an exemption applies to you. The Diocese has approved a return to congregational singing! Please join in heartily. Though distancing is no longer a requirement, please inquire of your nearest neighbours to ensure that all are comfortable and accommodated.

As reported in this week's Thurible letter, the parish mask mandate will be lifted on Wednesday, April 27. After that date masks will be strongly recommended but optional, unless public health regulations dictate otherwise.

CONFESSIONS DURING LENT
