RE-OPENING ST THOMAS'S CHURCH

Unless the public health situation changes, we expect to resume public worship at St Thomas's on September 13. Clergy, staff and volunteers are working on protocols for this, following diocesan guidelines based on government regulations and public health advice. These are complex. We will continue to make our liturgies available on the internet for those who are unable during the ongoing pandemic to come to church. Many aspects of our liturgical life will look and sound very different when we gather again on Huron Street, but the "source and summit" of our common life, the Holy Eucharist, remains in its essence unchanged, deo gratia!

EXCITING NEWS FROM THE REFUGEE COMMITTEE

We are very pleased to advise St Thomas's that the next group of refugees sponsored by the parish will be arriving shortly. Initially expected in the early spring, the pandemic halted travel for these newcomers until recently.

The refugee family we are expecting includes a young couple, Obaida Murad, his wife, Hazar, and their three children, daughters, Faeeza (8) and Huda (2) and a son, Mohammed (5). The Murad family fled Syria in 2017 when their neighbourhood in the city of Homs was bombed and destroyed, including their house and the business where Obaida worked. Since fleeing Syria, they have received shelter in Turkey. In coming to Toronto, the Murads will be reunited with some family members who have established their home in Toronto and who we have been fortunate to get to know as we have developed this sponsorship.

Refugee sponsorship has been a part of St. Thomas's social justice work since the sponsorship program was introduced by the Canadian government almost 40 years ago. Since the beginning of the most current refugee crisis in 2015, St. Thomas's has already sponsored five refugees.
