SEEKING GOD – Reading Scripture – How do we relate the two?

A study & conversation over five Wednesday evenings – January 10 to February 7, 2024 – 7:00 to 8:30 pm.

The place of scripture in contemporary Christian life is neither self-evident nor uncontroversial, so if a person would seek God through reading scripture, she or he must know how to undertake that task. There must be some clarity about the framework in which scripture is read, an appreciation of how scripture teaches the seeker and the believer, a willingness to face the difficulties of terminology and translation, and some effort to deal with, both as seeker and believer, the rhetoric employed by scriptural authors.

In the majestic language of the Book of Common Prayer we pray that God has caused all holy scriptures to be written for our learning, and we ask God to grant us so to hear those scriptures, and read, mark, learn, and inwardly digest them that we may embrace and hold fast to the blessed hope of everlasting life.

The requisite terms of the effort required to read Scripture prayerfully and productively can be understood in a useful foundational way through some mindful attention to two of the shortest 'books' of the Bible – the prophecy of Obadiah and the Second Letter of John, from the Old and New Testaments respectively.

In reading *Obadiah* and *2: John* together we will consider:

- 1. What is this thing called Scripture? Facing our assumptions, presumptions, prejudices and presuppositions. *Within what 'frame' do we read Scripture?*
- 2. How do Acting Divinity and responding humanity relate? In particular, what is the meaning of prophecy or bearing witness?
- 3. How are we to deal with the difficult words and the demanding images as these are transmitted to us? *How can we begin to discern the Spirit in its inspiration and communication in images?*
- 4. How do we receive and use terminology and translations? *How do the Hebrew, Greek, and English speaking minds talk to each other?*
- 5. How can the seeker move forward in the reading of Scripture? How does reading Scripture help the seeking and believing person, personally, in his or her unique faith journey?

John Stuart, already known to some of you through the courses he has run on Biblical Hebrew, will lead the sessions. To register or ask John a question about the study go to the Parish website under Upcoming Events and use the link there or use the link in the Thurible.

The means of meeting (virtual or in person) has not been finalized. Those registering will be asked to indicate their preferences, whether 'zoom,' or 'in person.'
