CHURCH SCHOOL

Church School Coordinator Siobhán Dungan invites **children ages 4 to 11** to be brought to the undercroft (accessed by descending the steps near the south entrance) on Sundays anytime after 10:45 a.m. The children learn about the Eucharist and Jesus' life and teachings through stories, singing, colouring, and fun exercises. Siobhán brings them upstairs to the church in time to sing the Lord's Prayer with the congregation and receive a blessing. In addition to children aged 4 and up, Siobhán welcomes **younger siblings** to sit in on Church School, as she has a helper who has babysitting training. Siobhán is in the same room as the babysitter to provide additional supervision and support. Parents are always welcome to stay as long as necessary for the children to acclimatize to the environment.

In addition, we are looking for a volunteer **Nursery Care Coordinator** (NCC) amongst our parishioners, who can advertise for nursery workers using various websites. This position is purely administrative and carries no expectation that the coordinator will serve in the nursery or even sub for any workers. With a babysitter available in the Sunday School area in the undercroft, we will always have a Plan B, but we do want to organize a rota of **paid nursery workers** to make managing the Church School a little easier on Siobhán! PASTORAL PRAYER & CARE AT THE END OF LIFE Do we know your end-of-life wishes?

Though death and dying never rank high on the list of people's favourite topics, they are important ones. When approaching the first of these last things, death, our loved ones and care providers will need to make decisions on our behalf—decisions that they hope will honour our wishes. This will be a tender time for those who love us. And as your church community, we want to know how best to care for you and your loved ones when this time comes.

If you haven't already thought through these questions, we invite you to do so now.

- Would you like the church to know if you have a health emergency? How will the clergy be notified?
- How would you like the church to accompany you through your last days?
- When you die, how will people know if would you like your funeral to be held at St. Thomas's? Do you have any special requests for the service?
- Is there anyone you would want us to reach out to in care and support?
- Do you have a will? Do you know the best way to make a charitable bequest, even if you don't think you will have very much to give?

Setting up each of the above takes some time and effort, but will help to ensure that things happen the way you hope. If you need assistance, please email <code>office@stthomas.on.ca</code> for details about making these arrangements. We would be happy to sit down and talk these things through with you, or refer you to professionals who can help. (Likewise, if you happen to be a professional in any of these areas, let us know; we are always expanding and updating our contacts.)

If you have already made plans, please ensure that St. Thomas's has access to them. With the recent transitions in clergy leadership, we are still in the process of reviewing and refining the systems we use to ensure that funeral planning, bequests, legacy gifts, and memorials may be found in a central repository regardless of who is on staff. Even if you have already given us a list of your wishes, it might be a good idea to check with us, just to be on the safe side.

As Romans 14:8 reminds us, whether we live or die, we are the Lord's. At St. Thomas's, we want to live and die confident in this faith, and to that end, we hope you will keep in touch with us at any time via *prayerandcare@stthomas.on.ca*, knowing that you are in our prayers now and evermore.
