PROVISOS FOR IN-PERSON ATTENDANCE

1. Given recent research, cloth masks on their own, unless worn with two disposable masks, provide insufficient protection. At all times, therefore, everyone in the church must wear an N95, KN95, or an acceptable equivalent mask. If you do not have one of these qualifying masks, the minimum acceptable coverage is two disposable medical face masks properly fitted. If you do not have an acceptable mask, two disposable masks will be issued to you at the door.

2. Congregational singing is still allowed, but we strongly recommend that you do so softly, if at all. Tuneful humming, such as when we are enjoying a piece of music on the radio, is fine; we want you to enjoy the music and to participate in it, but with this new variant that is several times more contagious than others, we can't encourage anything more than gentle singing behind your mask(s).

THE BAPTISM OF JULIAN KINGSTON MILES STUART

Son of Merry Anne & Duncan Stuart

The service starts in the Narthex. *Please stand when the bell rings.*

The priest will begin by saying:

Dearly beloved in Christ, seeing that God willeth all men to be saved from the fault and corruption of the nature which they inherit, as well as from the actual sins which they commit, and that our Saviour Christ saith, None can enter into the kingdom of God, except he be born anew of Water and of the Holy Spirit, I beseech you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that he will grant to this Child that which by nature he cannot have; that he may be baptized with Water and the Holy Spirit, and received into Christ's holy Church, and be made a living member of the same.

Let us pray:

Almighty and everlasting God, who through thy well-beloved Son Jesus Christ didst sanctify Water to the mystical washing away of sin: We beseech thee mercifully to look upon this Child; wash him and sanctify him with the Holy Spirit; that he may be received into thy holy Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in charity, may so pass through the dangers of this troublesome world, that finally he may come to the land of everlasting life, there to reign with thee world without end; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

The child will be brought into the church as the priest says:

Child, enter thou into the temple of God, that thou mayest have part with Christ unto everlasting life. **Amen.**

Then the priest shall say:

Beloved, in the Holy Gospel of our Saviour Christ, he commanded the children to be brought unto him; he blamed those that would have kept them from him; he exhorteth all men to follow their innocency. By his outward gesture and deed he declared his good will toward them; for he embraced them in his arms, he laid his hands upon them, and blessed them. Be ye, therefore, assured that he will likewise favourably receive this present child; that he will embrace him with the arms of his mercy; that he will give unto him the blessing of eternal life, and make him partaker of his everlasting kingdom. Wherefore we being thus persuaded of the good will of our heavenly Father toward this child, declared by his Son Jesus Christ, let us faithfully and devoutly give thanks unto him, and say together:

Celebrant and people:

Almighty and everlasting God, heavenly Father, We give thee humble thanks That thou hast called us to the knowledge of thy grace, And faith in thee: Increase this knowledge, and confirm this faith in us evermore. Give thy Holy Spirit to this child, That he may be born again, And may inherit everlasting salvation; Through our Lord Jesus Christ, Who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, Now and for ever. Amen.

THE **PROMISES**

Dearly beloved, you have prayed that our Lord Jesus Christ may be pleased to receive, cleanse, and sanctify this Child, and grant unto him the blessing of eternal life, which things Christ, for his part, will most surely perform. And now this Child, on his part, must through you, his Sponsors, promise and vow that he will renounce the devil and all his works, believe in Christ, and obediently keep God's commandments.

Then shall the Priest say to the Sponsors:

Do you, in the name of this Child, renounce the devil and all his works, the vain pomp and glory of the world, with all covetous desires of the same, and the sinful desires of the flesh, so that you will not follow nor be led by them? Answer, **I do.**

Then shall the priest say: Let us recite the Articles of our Belief.

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, Born of the Virgin Mary, Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, dead, and buried: He descended into hell; The third day he rose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Ghost; The holy Catholic Church; The Communion of Saints; The Forgiveness of sins; The Resurrection of the body, And the Life everlasting. Amen. Then shall the priest say to the Sponsors:

Do you, in the name of this Child, profess this faith? Answer: **I do**.

Do you, in the name of this Child, seek Baptism into this faith? Answer: **I do**.

Do you, in the name of this Child, acknowledge the duty to keep God's holy will and commandments, walking steadfastly in the Way of Christ? Answer: **I do**.

Will you pray for this Child, and take care that he may learn and do all these things? Answer: I will.

Then shall the Priest make the following supplications:

O merciful God, grant that all sinful desires may die in this Child, and that all things belonging to the Spirit may live and grow in him. **Amen**.

Grant that he may have power and strength to have victory, and to triumph against the devil, the world, and the flesh. **Amen**.

Grant that whosoever here shall begin to be of thy flock may evermore continue in the same. Amen.

THE BAPTISM

Priest: The Lord be with you; *People:* And with thy spirit.

Priest: Lift up your hearts;

People: We lift them up unto the Lord.

Priest: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God; *People:* It is meet and right so to do.

Then shall the Priest say:

It is very meet, right, and our bounden duty, that we should at all times, and in all places, give thanks unto thee, O Lord, Holy Father, Almighty, Everlasting God, for that thy most dearly beloved Son Jesus Christ upon the Cross, for the forgiveness of our sins, did shed out of his most precious side both water and blood; and after his glorious Resurrection gave commandment to his disciples, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost.

Regard, we beseech thee, the prayers of thy Church. Sanctify this Water to the mystical washing away of sin; and grant that this child, now to be baptized therein, may receive the fulness of thy grace and ever remain in the number of thy faithful and elect children; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, throughout all ages, world without end. *Amen*.

Then, taking the child into his arms, he shall say to the Sponsors: Name this Child.

And then, naming him after them, he shall pour water upon him, saying:

Julian Kingston Miles, I baptize thee In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. *Amen*.

Then shall the Priest say:

We receive this Child into the Congregation of Christ's flock, and do sign him with the sign of the Cross, in token that hereafter he shall not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified, and faithfully to fight under his banner against sin, the world, and the devil, and to continue Christ's faithful soldier and servant unto his life's end. *Amen*

Then shall the Priest say:

We yield thee hearty thanks, most merciful Father, that it hath pleased thee to regenerate Julian, with thy Holy Spirit, to receive him for thine own Child by adoption, and to make him a member of thy holy Church. Grant, O Lord, that being baptized into the death of Christ, he may also be made partaker of his resurrection, so that serving thee here in newness of life, he may finally, with all thy holy Church, inherit thine everlasting kingdom; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

THE DUTIES

The Priest shall say to the Sponsors and Parents:

Dearly beloved, forasmuch as you have brought Julian to be baptized into the family of Christ's Church, you must remember that it is your part and duty to see that he be taught what a solemn vow, promise and profession he has here made by you; and that he be instructed in the Creed, the Ten Commandments, the Lord's Prayer, the Church Catechism, and all other things which a Christian ought to know and believe to his soul's health, continually mortifying all evil desires, and daily increasing in all virtue and godliness of living.

Use all diligence therefore to see that he be virtuously brought up to lead a godly and a Christian life; teach him to pray, take him part in public worship, and to go forth into the world to serve God faithfully in the fellowship of his Church.

Will you be faithful in the fulfilment of these duties? *Answer:* I will, the Lord being my helper.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, whose beloved Son did share in Nazareth the life of an earthly home: Bless, we beseech thee, the home of this Child, and grant wisdom and understanding to all who shall have the care of her, that he may grow up in steadfast love and reverence of thy holy Name; through the same thy Son Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.

Priest: Receive the light of Christ to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

People: Thanks be to God.

The Ministers lead the baptismal party into the nave to return to their pews as the Choir sings:

THE FIRST LESSON: Jeremiah 31.7-14

The First Lesson is written in the thirty-first chapter of the book of the prophet Jeremiah, beginning at the seventh verse.

For thus says the Lord: "Sing aloud with gladness for Jacob, and raise shouts for the chief of the nations; proclaim, give praise, and say, 'The Lord has saved his people, the remnant of Israel.' Behold, I will bring them from the north country, and gather them from the farthest parts of the earth, among them the blind and the lame, the woman with child and her who is in travail, together; a great company, they shall return here. With weeping they shall come, and with consolations I will lead them back, I will make them walk by brooks of water, in a straight path in which they shall not stumble; for I am a father to Israel, and Ephraim is my first-born. "Hear the word of the Lord, O nations, and declare it in the coastlands afar off; say, 'He who scattered Israel will gather him, and will keep him as a shepherd keeps his flock.' For the Lord has ransomed Jacob, and has redeemed him from hands too strong for him. They shall come and sing aloud on the height of Zion, and they shall be radiant over the goodness of the Lord, over the grain, the wine, and the oil, and over the young of the flock and the herd; their life shall be like a watered garden, and they shall languish no more. Then shall the maidens rejoice in the dance, and the young men and the old shall be merry. I will turn their mourning into joy, I will comfort them, and give them gladness for sorrow. I will feast the soul of the priests with abundance, and my people shall be satisfied with my goodness, says the Lord."

The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**

The people remain seated as the choir sings the psalm.

PSALM: 147.12-20, *Tone VIII*, 1

12 Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem: / praise thy God, O Sion.

- 13 For he hath made fast the bars of thy gates, / and hath blessed thy children within thee.
- 14 He maketh peace in thy borders, / and filleth thee with the finest of the wheat.
- 15 He sendeth forth his commandment upon earth; / and his word runneth very swiftly.
- 16 He giveth snow like wool, / and scattereth the hoar-frost like ashes.
- 17 He casteth forth his ice like morsels: / who is able to abide his frost?
- 18 He sendeth out his word, and melteth them: / he bloweth with his wind, and the waters flow.
- 19 He showeth his word unto Jacob, / his statutes and ordinances unto Israel.
- 20 He hath not dealt so with any nation; / neither have they knowledge of his laws.

THE EPISTLE: Ephesians 1.3-14

The Epistle is written in the first chapter of St Paul's epistle to the Ephesians, beginning at the third verse.

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. He destined us in love to be his sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace which he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace which he lavished upon us. For he has made known to us in all wisdom and insight the mystery of his will, according to his purpose which he set forth in Christ as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. In him, according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to the counsel of his will, we who first hoped in Christ have been destined and appointed to live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, which is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

HOLY GOSPEL: John 1.1-18

The Lord be with you. And with thy spirit. The Holy Gospel is written in the first chapter of the Gospel according to Saint John, beginning at the first verse. Glory be to thee O Lord.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God; all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness to the light. The true light that enlightens every man was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world knew him not. He came to his own home, and his own people received him not. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God; who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father. (John bore witness to him, and cried, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, for he was before me.") And from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God; the only Son, who is in the bosom of the Father, he has made him known.

Celebrant: As our Saviour Christ hath commanded and taught us we are bold to say:

Our Father who art in heaven, Hallowed be thy Name, Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; And forgive us our trespasses, As we forgive them that trespass against us; And lead us not into temptation, But deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, For ever and ever. Amen.

The Celebrant greets the Deacon, Subdeacon and People with bows, then kneels to begin the Prayer of Humble Access.

HOLY COMMUNION

All who intend to receive Holy Communion pray together:

Celebrant: We do not presume

to come to this thy Table, O merciful Lord, Trusting in our own righteousness, But in thy manifold and great mercies. We are not worthy So much as to gather up the crumbs under thy Table.
