A CHANGE TO THE FORMAT OF EVENSONG AND DEVOTIONS UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE

Musical Prelude, Evensong and Coffee Hour on Zoom: Sundays at 4:00 pm

In order to minimize the number of gatherings on Sundays in the church, a plainchant evensong (without devotions) will be offered at 4:00 pm on Zoom on Sundays until further notice.

The time will begin with a ten to fifteen-minute musical prelude, followed by evensong and concluding with coffee hour.

The intention is for this service to have a similar feel to the celebrations of the Eucharist that were offered on Zoom from March to August of last year.

Typically, coffee hour, a time to visit and check in with one another, was held on Wednesday evenings over the past year. Sundays after evensong will now be the regular time for coffee hour for the time being.
