EVENSONG PRELUDE - Sunday, January 26 at 6:30 pm

Evensong Preludes showcase the many talented musicians in our parish and extended parish family while offering a time of quiet reflection before the service. Thank you to all the artists for their volunteer musical offerings.

This week's recital features the *Trois Aquarelles* for flute, piano, and cello by Philippe Gaubert and Clara Schumann's *Piano trio in g minor*, Op. 17, performed by Laura Bolt, Alexander Smith, and Xi Chen. Philippe Gaubert was an award-winning flautist before turning his hand towards conducting and composition. He held posts of both Professor of Flute at the Conservatoire de Paris and Principal Conductor of the Paris Opera. Written in 1846 for violin, cello, and piano, Clara Schumann's only piano trio represents her first attempt at writing music for instruments other than piano and voice. It is considered the masterwork among her compositions by some scholars, and greatly influenced her husband Robert's first piano trio.
