Masking

The Diocese of Toronto has now entered the Green Stage, leaving all policies to the parishes. Masks, preferably N95 or KN95, are encouraged. Please join in heartily in our congregational singing, following suit with the choir in their masking practices.

Though distancing is no longer a requirement, please inquire of your nearest neighbours to ensure that all are comfortable and accommodated.

The Common Cup

As has always been the case, communicants may choose to receive communion in one kind only (i.e. no one should feel obligated to receive both the bread and the wine).

As per Diocesan guidelines, communicants are asked *not* to dip the consecrated host into the chalice with their hand (the practice known as intinction) as an alternative to drinking from the chalice.

Beginning this Sunday, St. Thomas's will begin to offer low gluten communion hosts for those who have gluten allergies, sensitivities, or celiac. These hosts are approved for liturgical use in the Catholic Church in the United States Canada and contain less than 20 parts per million of gluten. Hosts like these have been deemed safe for consumption for those with Celiac.

The baking of the low gluten hosts is done in a dedicated bakery using positive air pressure to create a room that is free of contaminants. The equipment used in their production is also dedicated to the low gluten baking and is not used for regular altar bread production.

Low gluten communion hosts are available upon request. If you require one, please inform the sides people prior to the start of the service. The low gluten hosts will be kept in a dedicated pyx in a small bowl to prevent crosscontamination. When approaching for communion, please inform the priest that you require a low gluten host, and they will present the pyx to the communicant to open and consume.

ADVANCE CONSTRUCTION NOTICE

Please note that construction to rebuild the steps to the main door of the church (south-west door) will begin on Tuesday, August 2nd. During the construction, entrance to the church will be through the doors at the north-west corner, or using the parish hall doors.

Early this year, ERA Architects was contracted to review the deteriorating condition of the south-west steps and provide a proposal for rebuilding them. They determined that the past need to repeatedly repair the steps was due in large part to the absence of a firm substrate necessary to support the steps and landing, and worsened by water infiltration through the joints. They have designed a solution which, with proper maintenance, they expect will last for 40 years or longer.

On the advice of ERA, a contract has been signed with Historic Restoration to do the reconstruction work commencing on August 2. This will include removal and cleaning of the existing granite slabs, rebuilding the substrate to provide a secure base for the steps, adding black anti-slip carborundum strips into recessed grooves in each step for increased safety, and replacing the existing rusty steel handrails with new, elegant bronze ones. Due to the lead time for the manufacture of the handrails, it is expected that this entrance to the church may remain closed until the end of October. Thank you for your patience and understanding while this much needed work is being done.

We are very grateful for a generous donation from a parish family towards the costs of the reconstruction.
