Dear People of St Thomas's,

I am very grateful to have served as Interim Priest in Charge of the parish since November 25, 2019. If you include the 3 months when I served in this way during Fr Andrews' sabbath leave, I will have spent nearly 2 years at St Thomas's since 2018. That is long enough to have gotten to know you better than would have been the case during a "normal" interim. But its length, of course, has not the most unusual thing about this interim.

The pandemic has left us all reeling. We are only just beginning to grasp what its long-term effects will be on the Church and the world. Those of us who have celebrated the Eucharist and received Holy Communion throughout this time, broadcasting liturgies online and by videoconference, have done so knowing that we do it vicariously for those who can't. The Mystery at the heart of the Church has continued to animate its life even in the midst of lockdowns. What a privilege this has been for the priests and lay people called to serve in this way. I know you join me in thanking Fr D'Angelo, Fr Shire, the musicians and staff, the Wardens and all the many people of this parish family who have kept the basic shape of our common life going in the face of huge obstacles. As you welcome your new priest and his family into a beautifully refurbished Rectory, please be assured of my prayers and my gratitude for your generosity in so many ways, to the parish and to me personally.
