

PREACHER NEXT WEEK

Our homilist for the Patronal Festival on July 5 will be Peter Mentis, a former Greek Orthodox parish priest who was received into the Anglican Communion and is now a parishioner at St James Cathedral. Peter is campaign manager for FaithWorks, the annual appeal of the Anglican Diocese of Toronto building communities of compassion and hope. FaithWorks feeds, shelters, nurtures and befriends over 30,000 people in our community and around the world every year - since 1996 providing more than \$24 million to Anglican-affiliated ministries. Peter will remain online after the Eucharist to answer questions about FaithWorks and his own journey to the Anglican Church.

MICHAEL RUDMAN OSF

Brother Michael was professed in the Order of St Francis in an online liturgy on June 12 attended by Fr Brinton and Fr D'Angelo. OSF is a "non-traditional" community within the Franciscan family worldwide. Members share a common Rule of Life, and carry out ministries consistent with the Franciscan ideal but do not live together or hold property in common. They may be celibate, married or partnered. Fr D'Angelo blessed Br Michael's during a brief liturgy in the Lady Chapel.
