If you have difficulty registering to attend, or decide to come to Church after registration is closed, please do feel free to come to Church! The 8:00 and 9:30 am masses have not been filled to capacity, and social distancing has thus far been possible even at 11:00 am. The sidespeople will assist you in our ongoing efforts to be compliant. Be assured that thus far, there has been sufficient room every Sunday at all Services!

Please note that congregational singing is still not permitted.

The 9:30 and 11:00 am Eucharists will continue on YouTube and the 4:00 pm Evensong and Coffee Hour on Zoom until further notice.

Because we cannot yet return to singing live and in person, we are trying an experiment at the 11:00 am service: the use of pre-recorded music. If successful, the plan is to add some recorded elements to the 9:30 service, as well. Our hope is that this addition will be received as an enrichment of the liturgy, edifying to both those in church and worshipping with us via the Internet.

We are in the process of rendering past St. Thomas's choir recordings useable for livestreaming, but for now we have been given permission to use the Nicene Creed setting by Calvin Hampton (1938-1984), arranged by Peter Stoltzfus Berton (b. 1968) from "Strength, Joy, and Peace: A Choral Year from St. John's, Newport, RI," which was released last year at Fr.
